Dear Mayor Lemon:

The Department is in receipt of your City's ordinance relating to a bird sanctuary. The exhibited concern for Wildlife is commendable. Please know, however, there are no provisions under present state law for creation or registration of wildlife sanctuaries.

Of course, a city may under its police power prohibit the discharge of firearms for public safety reasons. Your city attorney can advise you in this regard.
